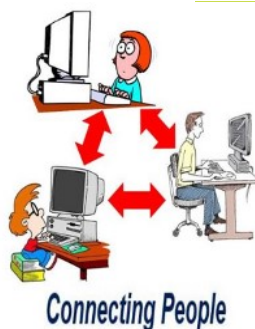
So, we keep on trying in different areas, like we have been doing in the past. Every camp is an investment in Revival and vital for our Survival. **Pastor Piet Visser**

## Editorial: Faith and politics

**Bible faith** is about sure things.

*Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.*

**Politics** is all about making/reaching a compromise between opposing ideas and convictions.

A satirical definition of compromise is:

*"Reaching an agreement about an issue and/or a course of action where no one is completely happy with".*

Mixing Bible faith and politics together is a disaster and it is clear that when politics (*compromise*) enters the church, God moves out.

Now, people being people, sometimes differences need to be resolved and it was determined many years ago that the way to do this was to call a "council".

According to the Encyclopaedia Britannica a "council" is defined as follows:

*"Council, in the Christian Church, a meeting of bishops and other leaders to consider and rule on questions of doctrine, administration, discipline, and other matters".*

In front of me I have a list of 56 Church "councils" which were all with one exception, meetings of (*Roman Catholic*) leaders to determine doctrine and resolve differences.

The exception according to "Wikipedia" is the first council, held in Jerusalem, and recorded in the book of acts, I quote:

*"Council of Jerusalem (or Apostolic Conference) is a name applied by historians and theologians to a Christian Apostolic Age council that was held in Jerusalem and dated around the year 50 AD"*  
*"The council decided that Gentile converts to Christianity were not obligated to keep most of the Law of Moses, including the rules concerning circumcision of males".*

Since that time there have been 55 more recorded councils in the Roman Catholic Church, all modelled on this way of doing things.

As most of us know, the RF adopted a similar way of running the Church, which seems to work quite satisfactorily

because the Bible is kept central and we are not governed by other conflicting authorities.

However, if we look at the track record of the RC Church we see interesting things. Here is a short list of some councils:

Let's highlight some of them:

19. **Council of Trent (1545–1563, with interruptions)** addressed church reform and repudiated Protestantism, defined the role and canon of Scripture and the seven sacraments, and strengthened clerical discipline and education.  
*(Temporarily attended by Lutheran delegates)*

This council is generally seen as the beginning of the inquisition where millions of protestants were killed.

20. **First Council of the Vatican (1870)** defined pope's primacy in church governance and his infallibility, repudiated rationalism, materialism and atheism, addressed revelation, interpretation of scripture and the relationship of faith and reason.

The so-called "church father"

Augustine was the one who chaired the 13<sup>th</sup> council at Carthage in 416-418 AD.

It was there that a decision was made about baptism by immersion verses "Christening" of babies.

The following statement was published:  
*"We want everyone who denies that*

*young children by "baptism" (Christening, sprinkling Ed.) are saved from their lost condition and are eternally saved, will be cursed!"*

This looks like a very complicated sentence but the statement simply says that babies, through 'Christening' are saved for ever.

Now we know that this is simply not true.

Further quote from Wiki:

*"That was the beginning, and to the present day proponents of biblical baptism by immersion, after a personal conversion, are within the traditional churches branded as heretics and churches where this mode of baptism is used, are often depicted as sects!"*

So, we are warned. Compromise (politics) will destroy our church as it has destroyed many other churches.

All that will be left then is "dead" buildings filled with "dead" people.

The only way to prevent this is to keep the Bible central

to everything

we do. Only

have now.



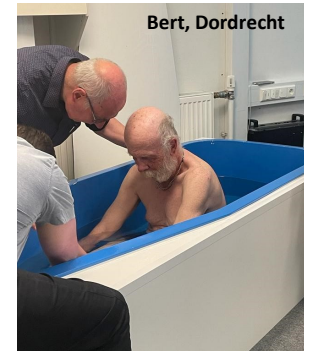

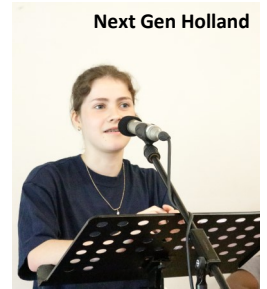
The "battle sessions" were great fun with the three teams competing and especially some of the leaders (enthusiastically) joining in. Team Levi won the NGC-cup this year!

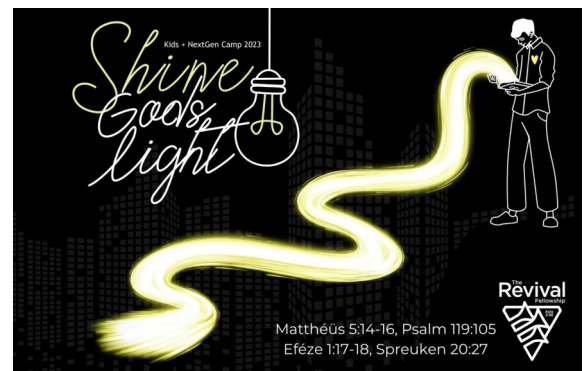

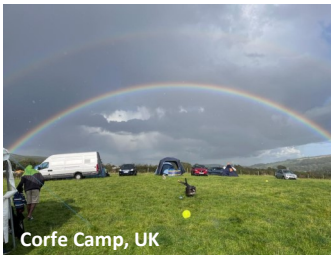

I have always lived in Wakefield and started married life with a nice bungalow and had two daughters – life was good; but when the girls were 16 and 10 everything went wrong and I found myself divorced and a few years later remarried with still more problems.

When I was in my 50's my sister and I started visiting various churches – Church of England and Baptist – hoping to find some meaning to life. We eventually visited a Pentecostal church which was well supported and where just a few people were said to have been baptised and received the Holy Ghost and spoke in new language given them by God, and as a result were always happy. However, as much as we tried, we never found anything there.
