

Editorial: A Dangerous Book

All throughout history, there have been numerous attempts to stop the publication of the Bible.



And/or, failing that, the second main religion of the world has more or less made it unnecessary to read the Bible. Why is that?

Basically, the Bible preaches freedom from slavery and that's bad for the "slave masters".

In the early years of the development of America, having slave labour, African and native American, (Indians) was normal. These people brought with them their own religion and superstitions. Mostly nature worship and all sorts of idols. (Rom 1:25)





But as time went by, these people started to learn to read and they discovered the Bible. It is probably fair to say that the abolition of slave labour and slave trade started with people discovering the Bible. After all, the Bible preaches equality in the sight of God.

Col 4:1 Masters, give unto your servants that which is **j**ust and **equal**; knowing that ye also have a Master in heaven.

As such, the Bible became a dangerous book to slave traders and owners. There are many accounts in history recorded of slave owners actively denying slaves an education.

Abraham Lincoln was the great exception to this.

Now, the Bible is still today a book which preaches freedom. The opponents of the Bible will try to convince the world in general of the opposite!

2Pe 2:17 These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever.

18 For when they speak great swelling words of vanity, they allure through the lusts of the flesh, through much wantonness, those that were clean escaped from them who live in error.

19 While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage.

So, freedom from what? In short, from slavery. Very much actual these day, many are a slave to fear.

The world, in general, and their leaders derive power from instilling more and more fear in others. But everybody can "escape" from slavery to freedom through becoming a son or daughter of God. We can opt-out from one master and become freely subject to another master who is not a "power hungry" dictator.

And there again, the opponents to the Bible are always trying to convince people of the opposite.

God is often presented as a dictator.

The question, of course, is why should he? He owns the whole universe, and lacks for absolutely nothing. Him being my boss makes no difference to Him. He simply wants to make everything better for his creation. And we are part of that creation, like it or not. Right now, many people in the world are simply terrified of dying.

How do we get out of this?

Simply, by being 'born again' we can escape fear. (1 John 4:18)
And then...

Heb 2:14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil;

15 And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

So, for us who are born again...

Ga 5:1 Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.



night meeting and it was very uplifting indeed. Also we had a combined meeting with the saints in Athens, USA for the first time. In the breakout room we had fellowship with a new brother just 2 weeks in the Lord. He was rejoicing and telling us how before being baptised he was running the streets, now God has given him a totally new and different life. Since his baptism his sister passed away, but he now has the comfort of the Lord and can be a testimony to his family.



Hungary

A sister broke one of her toes but could not find time to see a doctor. After prayer the pain disappeared and she got healed very quickly.

A brother cut through an electric wire that was in circuit while working on the electricity at home. There was a great deal of spark and bang but he wasn't hurt at all, praise the Lord. A sister lives in an old house where the chimney got blocked and an electricity socket was used in a dangerous way. She was unaware of both issues but the Lord protected her so that all could be noticed and fixed before disaster.

A sister saw the Lord's hand in her grandmother's recovery: she was operated on at the age of 85 and then got infected with the Covid19 virus in hospital. Her chances weren't good, but she recovered.

A brother's natural sister had an unexpected health problem and was operated on. He could turn to the Lord, find peace and talk about the Lord to his sister who not only

recovered but showed increasing interest in God. He also asked for holiday from work so he could help with work in the fellowship hall and has received a much longer one than he expected for which he praises the Lord. When he returned to work his boss welcomed him with a pay raise. Finally he got protected from Covid19, he did not catch it although his immediate boss caught it in an office of 1500 staff.

Ireland

Greetings from Ireland. Throughout the month of December each Friday, our brother took us through the book of

Revelation, it was extremely informative but also made us realise just how close we might be to the second coming!

As a soldier I always attended various church services of whichever denomination our changing padres were from.

I chose not to take the advice from citizens advice but turned to the Lord. Not long after, thousands of pounds were refunded to my account from company's I had taken loans and insurance from in the past. The Lord freed me from all my debts and saved me from losing my home. The Lord continues to be true to His word, praise the Lord.

I was brought up believing that going to church every Sunday, culture, refinement, and outward correction in life, will save me. I grew up in a community, where drugs and crime were common and admired by many young people. I was swayed away so easily and disobedience, disrespect, and rebellion were normal in my life.

A day without drugs would make me feel stressed and strained because of the addiction. As time went on when I hit rock bottom. I ended up in a psychiatric hospital for drug abuse. Three months later I was discharged from the hospital, hopelessness, pain, shame, and anxiety started to slither into my mind.

Isolating myself from everyone, sometimes I would think of ending my life. But I had hope that there was a God. I challenged Him, saying in my heart "if you are real show me that you are".

Praying and searching in different churches - it was all the same, no answers!

I did not expect to find God, in such an unexpected way. I was witnessed to by a brother on the bus where I was told about the truth, the beginning of Salvation from the word of God. I knew it was something I had to experience myself, straight from the scriptures.

October 2003 is when I received the Holy Spirit with the bible evidence of speaking in tongues and fulfilling the word of God in my life by water baptism.

I was healed from drug addiction, an anxiety disorder, worry, social withdrawal, and I found Peace, Joy, Freedom and most of all believing that God is real. If you seek Him, you'll find Him.
