Editorial: Vision.

Most of us take it for granted, just the ability to see, *and*, to see colours. But for many people that is not so easy. I just came across a news item regarding what we see, *and*, what is really there.

Just have a look at the link and see the reaction of two brothers who were born colour blind and for the first time could see colours with the aid of modern technology.

Another, related, news item caught my attention, here it is, quote: "Tetrachromats can see colours that most people cannot — up to 100 million, estimates suggest, which is 100 times that of the average human. Most people have three cells, or receptors, in their retinas, but tetrachomats have a fourth receptor, which may be what allows for their heightened colour perception. They are usually female, and it's estimated that about 12 percent of women carry the gene for this fourth receptor. Carrying the gene doesn't guarantee that you'll wind up with heightened colour vision, but those who both have the gene and who are immersed in a wide range of colours from a very young age appear to be more likely to develop the ability.

*So, w*hat is it Like To See 100 Million Colours?

For a start, what we see as grey is actually an incredible mixture of all sorts of different colours. Concetta Antico is one of these people who have this amazing ability.



She says: I see colours in other colours. For example, I'm looking at some light right now that's peeking through the door in my house. Other people might just see white light, but I see orange and yellow and pink and green and some magenta and a little bit of blue.

She paints what **she** sees but, unfortunately, we, with the ability to see only 1% of what she can see are still limited. It must be very frustrating for her to try to share with us what she sees and to find out that we cannot see it (all). Here are some of her paintings:

This got me thinking about **spiritual vision.** How much is there in reality which we cannot see (yet)?

Let's consider the following scriptures about one of the many wars described in the OT:

2Ki 6:8 Then the king of Syria warred against Israel, and took counsel with his servants, saying, In such and such a place [shall be] my camp.

14 Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about.

15 And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots.
And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do?
16 And he answered, Fear not: for they that be with us are more than they that be with them.
17 And Elisha prayed, and said, LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.

So, how much do <u>WE</u> "see"? Is it possible that a brother of sister sees more than we do? Shouldn't we be open to advice from our pastors and leaders? Are we perhaps stopping our growth because we think we know all there is to know.

Surely, with God being eternal, all knowing, all powerful, we will never stop increasing in "vision" until the Lord returns. It's a great life full of discoveries although sometimes

difficult to explain to people who cannot see it (yet).




