Editorial: The greatest danger

The greatest danger to the effectiveness of any <u>Revival</u> situation has always been divisions within the church.

Most of the first epistle from Paul to the Corinthian church deals with this.

1Co 1:10 Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.

11 For it hath been declared unto me of you, my brethren, by them which are of the house of Chloe, that there are contentions among you.

12 Now this I say, that every one of you saith, I am of <u>Paul;</u> and I of <u>Apollos</u>; and I of <u>Cephas</u>; and I of <u>Christ.</u>

13 Is Christ divided? was Paul crucified for you? or were ye baptized in the name of Paul?

So, we see here a possible 4 way split and possibly a number of swinging voters among this as well.

Needless to say that in cases like this, Revival is not going to happen and miracles and healings will also suffer.

And then there is the possibility that... Ac 20:30 Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them.

And...

The fourth possibility in 1Co 1:12, "I of Christ"

These are the people who have become their own pastor and consider themselves to be above the structure of the Church.

This structure is as described here: **Eph 4:11** And He gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers:

12 For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:

13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

14 That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;

Now there have always been attempts to destroy unity and sabotage the plan of God.

In the old testament there are many examples of how this is done. All have to do with destroying unity and mostly lead by men and women of an inflated sense of ego. A well known story is:

Nu 16:1 Now Korah, the son of Izhar, the son of Kohath, the son of Levi, and Dathan and Abiram, the sons of Eliab, and On, the son of Peleth, sons of Reuben, took men:

2 And they rose up before Moses, with certain of the children of Israel, two hundred and fifty princes of the assembly, famous in the congregation, men of renown:

3 And they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron, and said unto them, Ye take too much upon you, seeing all the congregation are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is among them: wherefore then lift ye up yourselves above the congregation of the LORD?

This was a strong accusation against Moses personally.

The end result of all of this was close on 15,000 deaths!

Home work, read the book of Jude...



In my first fourteen years in the Lord, "growing up" in Adelaide I learned a lot of things regarding this subject.

At first, I was astounded to discover that not everybody was as delighted as I was with my born again experience, my assembly, my pastors and oversight.

I learned about disgruntled people and why they were disgruntled.

I must honestly say that I have rarely come across a justified grudge. It was mostly about unimportant things. What was astounding though was that some people go on as good loyal saints for many years and then something happens

and they change completely. I have never understood this.

All this stuff will always create an environment of "Us and Them". If not fixed it will grow further into: Heb 12:15 Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled;

So, an effective fellowship, in signs, wonders and miracles, including regular

baptisms, is a unified fellowship. Home work: Ps 133, Gal 4:16 and John 15:1-2

- Having fellowship is not just about spending idle time together, but having real spiritually encouraging conversations
- You cannot separate your relationship with God from your relationship with your brothers and sisters

We hired out the full site which included the 18th Century House, to maximise numbers (30 on a shared basis) and the remainder booked accommodation off site.

Throughout the week we heard really uplifting and inspiring talks, heart felt testimonies, songs and witnessed some funny skits too. In between the meetings we had time for lots of fellowship; relaxing in the lovely holiday

Most of us took part in the Czech Autumn camp, some overcoming great difficulties on the way. A young sister saw God's glory when it turned out that she knew the bible better than her classmates and she could tell why. A sister praises the Lord for a new place she could move in and for the help she received in moving. Another sister saw God's hand as some complicated regulations changed so they now don't have to pay a large sum to register the house and property they moved in. A brother was healed by prayer of a vascular tumor on his hand that doctors believed will need to be removed with surgery.

Some testimonies: a brother who was suddenly made redundant, was soon after offered two good jobs to choose from; a young sister who was struggling to get a job interview got one after prayer with some sisters! Remembering Pastor Martin Polhill.



Martin came to the Lord in 1986 after being told the Gospel eight years previously by his Uncle Sid and Auntie Jill who had come to the Lord in Australia. His mum, dad and aunt were converted and continued to faithfully preach to Martin and his wife, Lisa. The turning point came when some families from Adelaide came to the UK to see if they could start a fellowship in the North London area.

Around this time Martin and Lisa met the saints. His mum suggested the pastor pray for their son, Russell, who was suffering with a food intolerance. Knowing they always wanted what was best for their son, Martin and Lisa agreed. Russ was healed. Just a few weeks later, Lisa came home and announced she wanted to be baptised. This was a huge shock to Martin who had always been the one who had an understanding that baptism was important. They were baptised and a few months later Martin received the Holy Spirit, speaking in tongues. If you asked him, he would probably say that the most notable changes were that Lord gave him confidence and a clear direction to follow. He loved being part of a worldwide fellowship where the Truth was faithfully shared.

In 2017, Martin was diagnosed with kidney cancer which had already spread. The doctors told him this was incurable, but some treatment could be offered. During the next five and a half years there were many ups and downs, but the Lord was there throughout. At one time, Martin required radiosurgery for a brain tumour. Four weeks later this had grown so quickly that the surgeon was unable to 'zap' it all. He would have to have further major surgery. After prayer, without any further treatment, the tumour reduced from 27mm to 3mm.

In the last few months of his life Martin continued praising the Lord and was at peace. He fell asleep to wait for the resurrection. One of his favourite stories from the Bible was about the woman who boldly proclaimed 'it is well'. That was always how he lived and would have wanted us to continue on with.
